Geography—The School Environment



Environmental geography is a study of how humans interact with physical geography. Problems include litter pollution, noise pollution and deforestation

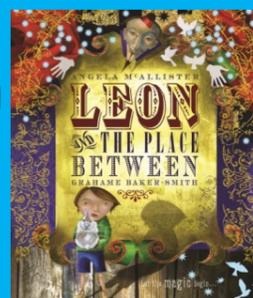

In this unit the children will be writing a narrative to entertain. Their narrative will be based upon a journey to a magical place. As a stimulus for their writing the children will be using 'Leon and the Place Between' by Angela McAllister. We will focus upon using expanded noun phrases, accurately punctuated dialogue, adverbials to link ideas and a range of conjunctions.



We will be writing Haiku poems. These are traditional Japanese poems. We need to think about the form. Haiku poems normally have three lines and do not rhyme.

Haiku poems are normally about seasons or weather, they do not explain or tell
