We will also be working at learning to tell the time to the minute on both analogue and digital clocks.

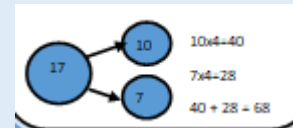
17x 4 =

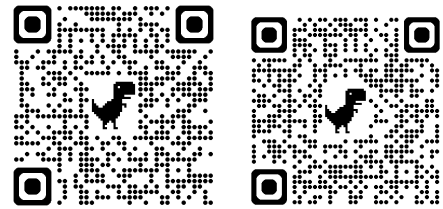
Jesus at the Heart of all that we do.

Science – Forces and Magnets



This half term in science we will be looking at forces and magnets.

A force is an action that changes or maintains the motion of a body or object.

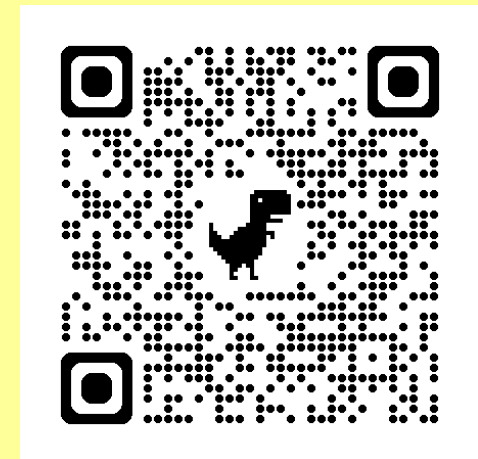
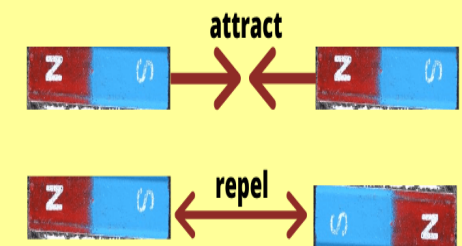
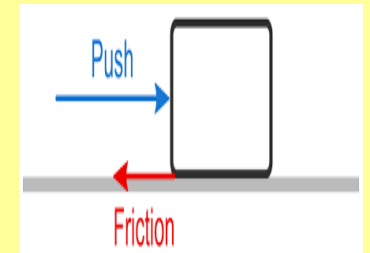
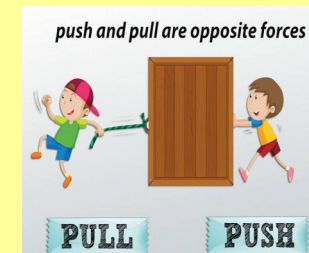
We will also be exploring magnets, thinking about what materials are magnetic, and how the poles of magnets attract and repel each other.

Sticky Knowledge

A force is a push or a pull—forces can make things move, stop or change direction

Friction is a force between two surfaces– it slows things down when they rub together

Magnets have two poles: north and south—opposite poles attract, the same poles repel



DT– seasonal food.

We are looking at seasonal foods this term in DT. We will be exploring what it means for a food to be seasonal, and what foods are traditionally available in each season.

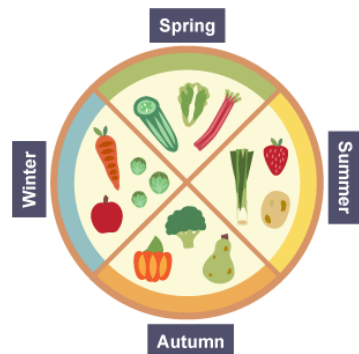
Children will be tasting some seasonal foods as well as planning and making some seasonal recipes.
