

Science

Children will learn about plants by exploring their parts, growth, needs, and life cycles.

When the conditions are right the seed soaks up water and swells and the tiny new plant bursts out of its shell, this is called germination

When a plant sprouts it grows new shoots

A shoot grows upwards from the seed or plant to find sunlight

Seed dispersal is when the seeds move away from the parent plant, they can be moved by the wind or animals

Plants make their own food in their leaves using sunlight.

All plants need water and sunlight to grow, without water seeds and bulbs will not germinate

R.E

History

Children will learn about the events of the Great Fire of London in 1666, how it started and spread, its impact on the city and the changes it led to in firefighting and building safety.

Sticky Knowledge about the Great Fire of London

- ☐ The fire spread very quickly because the houses were built very close to each other and made of wood.
- ☐ London was infested by rats and they were responsible for the plague.
- ☐ The type of fire appliances used in those days could not cope with the fire.
- ☐ The fire lasted for 4 days and destroyed large areas of London, making thousands of people homeless. It began on 2nd September 1666AD.
- ☐ A famous man called Samuel Pepys kept a diary of the events and that is one of the reasons we know about what happened.
- ☐ The fire started in a bakery in Pudding Lane in London. The bakery belonged to Thomas Farynor.

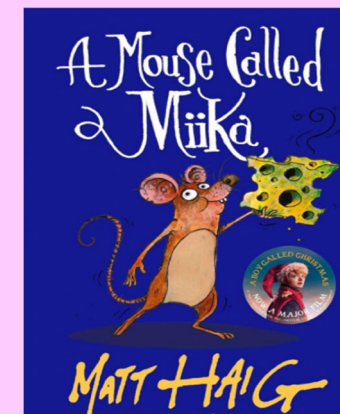


RSE
